





And Dad said, "In the book of I Corinthians, chapter 5 talks about some of the people who were proud in their sin."


You are <u>puffed up</u> and did not grieve instead, so that he who did this deed might be taken out of your midst.





Genesis 15:5









The people took their bread dough before it was leavened; because their dough pans were already in their backpacks. The children of Israel did as Moses said and took from the Egyptians jewels of silver, of gold, and raiment. The LORD gave the people favor in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they gave to them what they asked for. They spoiled the Egyptians. (Exodus 12-34-36) And on that day, the children of Israel assembled at Rameses from all parts of Goshen.




The children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand on foot that were men, beside children. A mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle. Exodus 12:37-38 They left from Rameses on the fifteenth day of the first month; on the day after the Passover the children of Israel went out with a high hand in the sight of all the Egyptians. For the Egyptians were burying all their firstborn, which the LORD had killed among them: upon their gods also the LORD executed judgments. Numbers 33:3-4




And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough which they brought forth out of Egypt, for it was not leavened; because they were thrust out of Egypt, and could not tarry, neither had they prepared for themselves any victual.

Exodus 12:39




Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years. 



...and by night in a pillar of fire, to give them light; to go by day and night: He took not away the pillar of the cloud by day, or the pillar of fire by night, from before the people.





Exodus 14:6-8






And the children of Israel went into the midst of the sea upon the dry ground: and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left.



And the Egyptians pursued, and went in after them to the midst of the sea, even all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen. Exodus 14:23







"Much," replied Dad, "We will see in scripture that Jesus was put in the grave late on Passover Day (*Wednesday*), just before the Holy Day, the First Day of Unleavened Bread which is an annual Sabbath. After being in the grave for 3 nights and 3 days, Jesus was resurrected just before the weekly Sabbath ended at sundown. Then on the first day of the weeks (*Sunday*) He became our Wave Sheaf Offering."



After Jesus was betrayed by Judas Iscariot when he had agreed to being paid 30 pieces of silver by the Chief Priest and the Council.



Jesus was crucified on the Passover day.

While on the cross, the Roman Solders cast lots for his garments.




At the 9<sup>th</sup> hour (3 P.M.), after a Roman Solder had stuck a spear in His side, Jesus said, Father into Your hands I commit my spirit and then Jesus died.



Jesus was then put into a new grave that was in the garden near where Jesus was crucified. Several ladies were watching as the grave was closed.



The disciples prepared His body and put Him in the tomb just before sundown as the Passover Day was ending. The First day of Unleavened Bread (an Annual Sabbath or High Day) began at sundown. Jesus was then in the grave for 3 nights and 3 days.



Now on the next day, which followed the preparation day, the chief priests and the Pharisees came together to Pilate, saying, "Sir, we remember that that deceiver said while He was living, 'After three days I will rise." There-fore, command that the sepulcher be secured until the third day; lest His disciples come by night and steal Him away, and say to the people, 'He is risen from the dead'; and the last deception shall be worse than the first." Then Pilate said to them, "You have a guard. Go, make it as secure as you know how." And they went and made the sepulcher secure, sealing the stone and setting the guard. Matthew 27:62-66



Now on the first day of the weeks, they came to the tomb at early dawn, bringing the spices that they had prepared; and certain others came with them. Luke 24:1-4


And in the morning suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled away the stone from the door, and sat upon it. 


Then Mary Magdalene came to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken away the Lord from the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him." As a result, Peter and the other disciple (John) went out and came to the tomb. Now the two ran together, but the other disciple ran faster than Pert and came to the tomb first; and he stooped down and saw the linen clothes lying there, but he did not enter.

John 20:2-5



Then Simon Peter came following him, and he went into the tomb and saw the linen clothes lying, and the napkin that had been on His head, not lying with the linen clothes but folded up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who had come to the tomb first, also went in and saw these things; and he believed. For they did not yet understand the scripture which decreed that He must rise from the dead. Then the disciples went away again to their home.

John 20:6-10



Jesus said to her, "Mary." Turning around, she said to Him, "Rabboni"; that is to say, "Teacher." Jesus said to her, "Do not touch Me, because I have not yet ascended to My Father. But go to My brethren and tell them that I am ascending to My Father and your Father, and My God and your God." Mary Magdalene came to the disciples, bringing word that she had seen the Lord, and that He had said these things to her. John 20:16-18

Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, When you be come into the land which I give unto you, and shall reap the harvest thereof, then you shall bring a sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest unto the priest: and he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD, to be accepted for you: on the morrow after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it. And you shall offer that day when you wave the sheaf an he lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering unto the LORD. Leviticus 23:10-12






This literal translation of the Greek words shows that the day which followed the weekly Sabbath was the first day of the seven-week count to Pentecost, thus identifying this day as the Wave Sheaf Day (Lev. 23:10-11, 15-16). The ascension of Jesus Christ on that day fulfilled the offering of the wave sheaf for all time.

And as they were going, behold, some of the guard went into the city and reported to the chief priests all the things that were done. Then, after gathering together with the elders and taking council, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers, saying, "Tell everyone that His disciples came by night and stole Him while you were sleeping. And if the governor hears of this, we will persuade him to release you from responsibility." And they took the money and did as they were instructed; and this report has been spread abroad among the Jews to this day.

And behold, on the same day, two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, which was about sixty furlongs from Jerusalem. And they were talking with one another about all the things that had taken place. And if came to pass, as they were talking and reasoning, that Jesus Himself drew near and went with them; But their eyes were restrained, so that they did not know Him

They told Jesus, how certain women had astonished them, after the women went to the tomb early and declared that they had indeed seen a vision of angels, who said, "He is living" and also other events that happened.

And as they approached the village where they were going, Jesus appeared to be going on farther. But they constrained Him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is toward evening, and the day is declining." And He entered in as if to stay with them. Luke 24:19-29



And it came to pass, as He sat at the table with them, He took the (unleavened) bread and blessed it; and after breaking it, He gave it to them. Then their eyes were opened, and they knew Him; and He disappeared from them. And they said to one another, "Did not our hearts burn within us as He was speaking to us on the road, while He was opening the Scriptures to us?" Luke 24:30-32



And they rose up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem; and they found the eleven and those with them assembled together, saying, "In truth, the Lord has risen! And He has appeared to Simon." Then they related the things that had happened to them on the road, and how He was known to them in the breaking of the (unleavened) bread. Luke 24:33-35
