THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Part 1 – Exodus 20:1-12

- 1. And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, Who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. You shall have no other gods before Me.
- 2. You shall not make for yourselves any graven image, or any likeness of anything that is in the heavens above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the waters under the earth. You shall not bow yourself down to them, nor serve them, for I, the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children unto the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, But showing mercy to thousands of those who love Me and keep My commandments.
- 3. You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work. But the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD your God. In it you shall not do any work, you, nor your son, nor your daughter; your manservant, nor your maidservant, nor your livestock, nor the stranger within your gates. For in six days the LORD made the heaven and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and sanctified it.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother so that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God gives you.

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Part 2 – Exodus 20:13-17; Mark 12:28-31

- 6. You shall not murder.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery.
- 8. You shall not steal.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is your neighbor's ."

And one of the scribes who had come up to Him, after hearing them reasoning together and perceiving that He answered them well, asked Him, "Which is the first commandment of all?" Then Jesus answered him, "The first of all the commandments is, 'Hear, O Israel. Our one God is the Lord, the Lord. [traditionally translated "Hear O Israel, the Lord our God is one Lord."] And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' This is the first commandment. And the second is like this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."

THE WEEKLY SABBATH

Genesis 2:1-4; Exodus 31:12-17

Thus the heavens and the earth were finished, and all the host of them. And by the beginning of the seventh day God finished His work which He had made. And He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had made. And God blessed the seventh day and sanctified it because on it He rested [Hebrew shabbat meaning to Cease; God ceased or sabbathized from His work. God's spiritual work, however, continues even on the Sabbath day. John 5:17 But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I work." Hebrews 4:4 For He spoke in a certain place about the seventh day in this manner: "And God rested on the seventh day from all His works."] from all His work which God had created and made. This is the account of the heavens and of the earth when they were created; in the day that the LORD God made the earth and the heavens.

And the LORD spoke to Moses saying, "Speak also to the children of Israel, saying, 'Truly you shall keep My Sabbaths, for it [the keeping of God's Sabbaths] is a sign between Me and you throughout your generations to know that I am the LORD Who sanctifies you. You shall keep the Sabbath therefore, for it is holy to you. Everyone that defiles it shall surely be put to death, for whoever does any work on it, that soul shall be cut off from among his people.

Six days may work be done, but on the seventh day is the Sabbath of rest, holy to the LORD. Whoever does any work on the Sabbath day, he shall surely be put to death. Therefore the children of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, to observe the Sabbath throughout their generations as a perpetual covenant.

It is a sign between Me and the children of Israel forever; for in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, and on the seventh day He rested, and was refreshed.'"

Part 1 – Leviticus 23:1-14

And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel and say to them, 'Concerning the appointed feasts of the LORD, which you shall proclaim to be holy convocations, even these are My appointed feasts.

Six days shall work be done, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of rest, a holy convocation. You shall not do any work. It is a Sabbath to the LORD in all your dwellings. These are the appointed feasts of the LORD, holy convocations which you shall proclaim in their appointed seasons.

In the fourteenth day of the first month, between the two evenings, is the LORD'S Passover, And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the Feast of Unleavened Bread to the LORD.

You must eat unleavened bread seven days. On the first day you shall have a holy convocation. You shall not do any servile work therein, But you shall offer a fire offering to the LORD seven days. In the seventh day is a holy convocation. You shall do no servile work therein.'"

And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel and say to them, 'When you have come into the land which I give to you, and shall reap the harvest of it, then you shall bring the premier sheaf of the firstfruits of your harvest to the priest. And he shall wave the sheaf before the LORD to be accepted for you. On the next day after the Sabbath the priest shall wave it. And you shall offer that day when you wave the sheaf, a male lamb without blemish of the first year for a burnt offering to the LORD. And its grain offering shall be two tenth parts of fine flour mixed with oil, an offering made by fire to the LORD for a sweet savor. And the drink offering of it shall be of wine, the fourth part of a hin.

And you shall eat neither bread, nor parched grain, nor green ears until the same day, until you have brought an offering to your God. It shall be a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings.

Part 2 – Leviticus 23:15-26

And you shall count to you beginning with the next day after the Sabbath, beginning with the day that you brought the sheaf of the wave offering; seven Sabbaths shall be complete. [The Hebrew means, seven complete weeks, each ending with the seventh-day Sabbath.] Even unto the day after the seventh Sabbath you shall number fifty days. [The fiftieth day is always the first day after the seventh Sabbath, which is also the first day of the eighth week.]

And you shall offer a new grain offering to the LORD. You shall bring out of your homes two wave loaves of two tenth parts. They shall be of fine flour. They shall be baked with leaven, They are the firstfruits to the LORD. And you shall offer with the bread seven lambs without blemish of the first year, and one young bull, and two rams. They shall be for a burnt offering to the LORD with their grain offering, and their drink offerings, even an offering made by fire, of sweet savor to the LORD. Then you shall sacrifice one male goat for a sin offering, and two lambs of the first year for a sacrifice of peace offerings.

And the priest shall wave them with the bread of the firstfruits, a wave offering before the LORD, with the two lambs. They shall be holy to the LORD for the priest. And you shall proclaim on the same day that it may be a holy convocation to you. You shall do no servile work therein. It shall be a statute forever in all your dwellings throughout your generations.

And when you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not completely reap the corners of your field. And the gleaning of your harvest you shall not gather. But you shall leave them for the poor and for the stranger. I am the LORD your God.'"

And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Speak to the children of Israel saying, 'In the seventh month, in the first day of the month, you shall have a Sabbath, a memorial of blowing of ram's horns, [a day of horn blasting.] a holy convocation. You shall do no servile work therein but you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD.'"

Part 3 – Leviticus 23:27-36

And the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, "Also, on the tenth day of this seventh month, is the Day of Atonement. It shall be a holy convocation to you. And you shall afflict your souls and offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. And you shall do no work in that same day, for it is the Day of Atonement, in order to make an atonement for you before the LORD your God, for whoever is not afflicted in that same day, he shall be cut off from among his people.

And whoever does any work in that same day, the same one will I destroy from among his people. You shall do no manner of work. It shall be a statute forever throughout your generations in all your dwellings. It shall be to you a Sabbath of rest, and you shall afflict yourselves. In the ninth day of the month at sunset, from sunset to sunset, you shall keep your Sabbath."

And the LORD spoke to Moses saying, "Speak to the children of Israel, saying, 'The fifteenth day of this seventh month shall be the Feast of Tabernacles for seven days to the LORD. On the first day shall be a holy convocation. You shall do no servile work therein. Seven days you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD.

On the eighth day shall be a holy convocation to you. And you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD. It is a solemn assembly. And you shall do no servile work therein.

Part 4 – Leviticus 23:37-44

These are the feasts of the LORD which you shall proclaim to be holy convocations to offer an offering made by fire to the LORD, a burnt offering and a grain offering, a sacrifice, and drink offerings, everything on its day; besides the Sabbaths of the LORD, and besides your gifts, and besides all your vows, and besides all your freewill offerings which you give to the LORD.

Also in the fifteenth day of the seventh month, when you have gathered in the fruit of the land, you shall keep a feast to the LORD seven days. On the first day shall be a Sabbath, and on the eighth day shall be a Sabbath. And you shall take the boughs of beautiful trees for yourselves on the first day, branches of palm trees, and the boughs of thick trees, and willows of the brook.

And you shall rejoice before the LORD your God seven days. And you shall keep it a feast to the LORD seven days in the year. It shall be a statute forever in your generations. You shall keep it in the seventh month. You shall dwell in booths seven days. All that are born Israelites shall dwell in booths, so that your generations may know that I made the children of Israel dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt. I am the LORD your God.'"

And Moses declared the appointed feasts of the LORD to the children of Israel.

THE CHRISTIAN PASSOVER

The Symbols of The New Covenant John 13:3-15; Matthew 26:26-28

Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come from God and was going to God, rose from supper and laid aside His garments; and after taking a towel, He secured it around Himself. Next, He poured water into a washing basin and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel which He had secured. Then He came to Simon Peter; and he said to Him, "Lord, are You going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered and said to him, "What I am doing you do not understand now, but you shall know after these things." Peter said to Him, "You shall not wash my feet, not ever." Jesus answered him, "If I do not wash you, you have no part with Me." Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head." Jesus said to him, "The one who has been washed does not need to wash anything other than the feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all." For He knew the one who was betraying Him; this was the reason He said. "Not all of you are clean."

Therefore, when He had washed their feet, and had taken His garments, and had sat down again, He said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call Me the Teacher and the Lord, and you speak rightly, because I am. Therefore, if I, the Lord and the Teacher, have washed your feet, you also are duty-bound to wash one another's feet; for I have given you an example, to show that you also should do exactly as I have done to you."

And as they were eating, Jesus took the bread and blessed it; then He broke it and gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is My body." And He took the cup; and after giving thanks, He gave it to them, saying, "All of you drink of it; for this is My blood, the blood of the New Covenant, which is poured out for many for the remission of sins."

THE CHRISTIAN PASSOVER

The wrong and the correct practices explained 1 Corinthians 11:17-22, 23-26, 27-34

Now in this that I am commanding you, I do not praise you, because when you assemble together, it is not for the better but for the worse. For first of all, I hear that there are divisions among you when you are assembled together in the church, and I partly believe it. For it is necessary that heresies be among you, so that the ones who are approved may become manifest among you. Therefore, when you assemble together in one place, it is not to eat the Lord's supper. For in eating, everyone takes his own supper first; now on the one hand, someone goes hungry; but on the other hand, another becomes drunken. WHAT! Don't you have houses for eating and drinking? Or do you despise the church of God, and put to shame those who have nothing? What shall I say to you? Shall I praise you in this? I do not praise you!

For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you, that the Lord Jesus in the night in which He was betrayed took bread; And after giving thanks, He broke it and said, "Take, eat; this is My body, which is being broken for you. This do in the remembrance of Me." In like manner, He also took the cup after He had supped, saying, "This is the cup of the New Covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in the remembrance of Me." For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you solemnly proclaim the death of the Lord until He comes.

For this reason, if anyone shall eat this bread or shall drink the cup of the Lord unworthily, he shall be guilty of the body and the blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup accordingly Because the one who eats and drinks unworthily is eating and drinking judgment to himself, not discerning the body of the Lord. For this very reason, many are weak and sickly among you, and many have fallen asleep. Now if we would examine ourselves, we would not be judged. But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, so that we will not be condemned with the world.

So then, my brethren, when you assemble together to eat the bread and drink the cup, wait for one another. But if anyone is hungry, let him eat at home, so that there will be no cause for judgment when you assemble together. And the other matters I will set in order when I come.

For I say to you, unless your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, there is no way that you shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

You have heard that it was said to those in ancient times, 'You shall not commit murder; but whoever commits murder shall be subject to judgment.' But I say to you, everyone who is angry with his brother without cause shall be subject to judgment. Now you have heard it said, 'Whoever shall say to his brother, "Raca," shall be subject to the judgment of the council.' But I say to you, whoever shall say, 'You fool,' shall be subject to the fire of Gehenna.

Part 3 – Matthew 5:23-32

For this reason, if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, Leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way; first be reconciled with your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Agree with your adversary quickly, while you are in the way with him; lest your adversary deliver you to the judge, and the judge deliver you to the officer, and you be cast into prison. Truly I say to you, there is no way that you shall come out of there until you have paid the very last coin.

You have heard that it was said to those in ancient times, 'You shall not commit adultery.' But I say to you, everyone who looks upon a woman to lust after her has already committed adultery with her in his heart. So then, if your right eye shall cause you to offend, pluck it out and cast it from you; for it is better for you that one of your members should perish than that your whole body be cast into Gehenna. And if your right hand shall cause you to offend, cut it off and cast it from you; for it is better for you that one of your members should perish than that your whole body be cast into Gehenna.

It was also said in ancient times, 'Whoever shall divorce his wife, let him give her a writing of divorcement.' But I say to you, whoever shall divorce his wife, except for the cause of sexual immorality, causes her to commit adultery; and whoever shall marry her who has been divorced is committing adultery.

Part 4 – Matthew 5:33-48

Again, you have heard that it was said to those in ancient times, 'You shall not forswear yourself, but you shall perform your oaths to the Lord.' But I say to you, do not swear at all, neither by heaven, for it is God's throne; nor by the earth, for it is the footstool of His feet; nor by Jerusalem, because it is the city of the great King. Neither shall you swear by your head, because you do not have the power to make one hair white or black. But let your word be good, your 'Yes' be yes and your 'No' be no; for anything that is added to these is from the evil one.

You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye, and a tooth for a tooth'; but I say to you, do not resist evil; rather, if anyone shall strike you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. And if anyone shall sue you before the law and take your garment, give him your coat also. And if anyone shall compel you to go one mile, go with him two.

Give to the one who asks of you; and do not turn away from the one who wishes to borrow from you. You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who despitefully use you and persecute you, So that you yourselves may be the children of your Father Who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not the tax collectors practice the same thing? And if you salute your brethren only, what have you done that is extraordinary? Do not the tax collectors practice the same thing?

Therefore, you shall be perfect, even as your Father Who is in heaven is perfect."

THE WAY OF LOVE

I Corinthians 13

If I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but do not have love, I have become a sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. If I have the gift of prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. And if I give away all my goods, and if I deliver up my body that I may be burned, but do not have love, I have gained nothing.

Love is patient and is kind; love envies not, does not brag about itself, is not puffed up. Love does not behave disgracefully, does not seek its own things, is not easily provoked, thinks no evil, does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth. For now we see through a glass darkly, but then we shall see face to face; now I know in part, but then I shall know exactly as I have been known. And now, these three remain: faith, hope and love; but the greatest of these is love.).

THE POSTPONEMENT RULES

Trumpets Declaration for 2023 AD

The Calculated Hebrew Calendar Postponement Rules

- **RULE ONE** When the Molad of Tishri or advancement occurs on a Sunday, Wednesday, or Friday, the declaration of Tishri 1 is advanced one day to a Monday, Thursday, or Saturday (Sabbath) respectively.
- **RULE TWO** When the Molad of Tishri occurs at noon (18 hours 0 parts) or later, the declaration of Tishri 1 is advanced to the next day.
- **RULE THREE** When the Molad of Tishri of a common year falls on Tuesday, at or after 9 hours and 204 parts, the declaration of Tishri 1 is advanced to Wednesday. The application of Rule One advances the declaration one more day to Thursday.
- **RULE FOUR** When the Molad of Tishri of a common year immediately following an intercalary year occurs on a Monday, at or after 15 hours and 589 parts, the declaration of Tishri 1 is advanced to Tuesday.

Trumpets Declaration for 2023 AD

- The Molad of Tishri occurs on Friday, September 15, 2023 AD, at 11 hours and 882 parts.
- The postponement rule(s) used to declare Feast of Trumpets: Rule(s) 1.
- The declaration of the Feast of Trumpets is, therefore, Saturday, September 16, 2023 AD.
- Trumpets 2023 AD ends the civil year 5783 and begins the civil year 5784. The civil year 5784 runs from Trumpets 2023 AD to Trumpets 2024 AD. It is year 8 of the 19-year lunar cycle and has 383 days.

The beginning of the first month, Nisan, for Calendar purposes, begins on the day obtained by calculating 177 days before Trumpets, from 1 Tishri, which is the seventh month of the year, according to the Calculated Hebrew Calendar. The full moon will be seen every year on the fifteenth day of Nisan and on the fifteenth day of Tishri. The date when the solar equinox occurs in March does not determine when Passover will occur, as the equinox may occur before, or after the day of Passover. Similarly, the solar equinox that occurs in September may occur before or after the Last Great Day after the 7-day Feast of Tabernacles.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Terms used that relate to the Hebrew Calendar by Calculation

Molad is the mean or average conjunction of the earth, moon, and sun; its mean or average length is 29.53059 days. The Molad is not the same as the astronomical conjunction.

Postponement – a one or two-day adjustment to the calculation of the Molad of Tishri. The Rules of Postponement enable the process of calculating the declaration of the new moon of Tishri to achieve the greatest degree of accuracy in relationship to the lunar cycle. **New moon in Scripture** – the visible crescent as seen from Jerusalem. Not the same as the astronomical new moon, which is not visible.

Part – a measurement of time in the Hebrew Calendar equating to 3 1/3 seconds. There are 18 parts to a minute and 1080 parts to an hour.

Months of the Hebrew Calendar alternate between 30 and 29 days in length. In leap years, add an extra month having 30 days, called Adar I, positioned immediately before Adar, the last month of 29 days, which then becomes Adar II. To add or subtract days in the year, adjust the 8th month (Heshvan), which is usually 29 days, and can be changed to 30 days, and adjust the 9th month (Kislev), which is usually 30 days, and can be changed to have 29 days.

Astronomical conjunction – the point in time during the dark phase of the moon, when the earth, moon, and sun line up on the same axis. The astronomical conjunction is not the Molad. **Astronomical new moon** – the moon's phase at total darkness. It is not the new moon of Scripture. **Dark of the moon** – the totally dark phase of the moon. It is not the new moon of Scripture. Referred to by astronomers as the "new moon". **Synodic month** – the interval between successive new moons. It is also known as a **lunation**. Its mean or average length is 29.53059 days, but the actual value can vary between 29 1/4 and 29 3/4 days. **Lunation** – the time taken by a complete cycle of phases of the moon, such as from one full moon to the next. A lunation is 29.53 days; it is the same as a synodic month.

Equinox – the time when the sun crosses the equator, making the length of day and night equal. **Autumnal equinox** – the point in time when the sun crosses the celestial equator moving southward, about September 23 each year. **Vernal equinox** – the point in time when the sun crosses the celestial equator moving northward, about March 21 each year.

Intercalary year – a year with a thirteenth month, specifically, years 3, 6, 8, 11, 14, 17, 19 of each 19-year cycle. Common year – any one of three types of years in the Hebrew Calendar; a deficient common year contains 353 days, a regular common year contains 354 days, and a perfect common year contains 355 days. Leap year – any of three types of years in the Hebrew Calendar; a deficient leap year contains 383 days, a regular leap year contains 384 days, and a perfect leap year contains 385 days.

Metonic cycle – the period of 19 calendar years (6939.6 days) after which the moon's phases recur on the same day of the year. Known by ancient astronomers around the world long before the Greek Meton. There are 235 lunations in a Metonic cycle.

Universal Time (UT) – the name given to Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) in 1928 for scientific purposes. **Jerusalem Time (JT)** – the mean solar time at the longitude of Jerusalem, counting from midnight. Expressed in hours and minutes. **Latitude** – the angular distance, measured in degrees, north or south of the equator. **Longitude** – the angular distance, measured in degrees, east or west of the prime meridian of Greenwich. **Time zones** – the 24 divisions of the earth, each 15 degrees broad, with the prime zone centered on the Greenwich meridian. Time in the zones to the east of Greenwich is ahead of GMT, while zones to the west of Greenwich are behind GMT. Jerusalem is east of Greenwich and ahead of Greenwich time by two hours. **UTC** is **Coordinated Universal Time**.
