From Begettal to a Son of God I

What did Jesus tell us? *Ask and you shall receive!* I asked the question and Byron brought me the answer, so I received it:

The circumference of the earth, 24,901 miles. A little over 1,000 miles an hour that you're traveling there. At the North Pole, ten feet from the Pole, the circumference is 78-1/2 feet, divided by 24 hours. You go 3.27 feet per hour. How about that? So, everything depends on the perspective.

That's why we need to look at God's perspective. In the letter that we just sent out, I talk about when life is formed in the womb. What we are going to do, we're going to talk about how it all began and what does God do and how will it end, that is for us as human beings who are called.

Jer. 1—Today we're able to analyze this in a little bit different way because we know that at the instant of impregnation by the sperm into the ovum that's when a new life begins.

Also in the letter you will see that even though they don't about the spirit of man, they can at least measure the effects of it. Much like you've heard of how they have people in serious conditions that they are able to monitor the brain waves. When the person is dead, it goes flat. What they're measuring with those waves is the working of the spirit of man and the physical brain together. So, when they expire, it goes flat. Why? Because the spirit goes back to God Who gave it.

Likewise if you come all the way to the beginning, here is how every single one of us began: a speck of dust so small that you would have to see it through a microscope to really understand it. Then the only thing you can do is observe and marvel it.

God is talking to Jeremiah, and He says. Jeremiah 1:5: "Before I formed you in the belly I knew you..."

Isn't it interesting, all human beings have 46 genes -23, 23. The 23^{rd} one is either an X or a Y or it can be an X and an X. That is the genetic definition of a woman -XX; XY is the definition of the male. The Y comes from the father, as well as the X. So, it's just like God says, the woman came from the man, likewise in procreation. The girl comes from the father and the mother. The boy comes from the father and the mother different combination on that 23^{rd} gene. Isn't that interesting, because the 23^{rd} gene determines the sex, but all the rest of us are in the 22 genes from father and from mother. Twenty-two is the number of the alphabet of the Hebrew.

What did God tell Adam and Eve at the first marriage when He married them? He said, 'The two shall become one flesh.' Now, think of that in conception: The mother passes on half of her genes, the father passes on half of his genes, and the new life is one flesh from father and mother, and different and unique.

In Adam and Eve God created all the genetic potential for all of human life, of all human races, from the beginning to the end. Jesus said He is 'the Beginning and the Ending, the First and the Last.' Human life does not exist until these actions take place:

The sperm penetrates the ovum. The ovum is from the mother, the sperm from the father. As soon as there is penetration, there is a 480-volt flash of electricity that takes place. That's really not electricity, that is only *a measurement of the spirit of man*. They can't see it, they don't know about the spirit of man, but without the spirit the body is dead.

Verse 5—God says: "Before I formed you, I knew you..." What was that one point in time when that would be possible? When the genes from the father and the mother are united with the spirit of man from God! God knew Jeremiah at that point, because what He created to be came into being.

"...and before you came forth out of the womb I consecrated you, *and* I ordained you a prophet to the nations" (v 5).

That's why every human life is from God. That's why even though conception may take place in a sinful manner—that is outside of marriage— God still gives the spirit of man to that individual, because that's what God created to be. Since God is true and cannot lie, it takes place.

As with everything else that God does for human beings, there's a blessing and there's a curse. If you follow God's ways, there will be blessings. To have blessings doesn't mean that you won't have trials. Trials can turn out to be blessings in the long run.

It's like one man asked me: Why am I going through this trial? *Of course, I don't know!* I told him, 'When you are through with it, you will understand.' That's the way it is with many trials we go through. You ask yourself: Why did this happen?

- maybe you did something wrong
- maybe you didn't do anything wrong
- maybe it's not even your fault

Look at everything that we've gone through with the trials in the Church at large. Some of it was maybe because of what we did, but a lot of it was because what the leaders did in not following God.

After we have gone through all of this, you look and see what a blessing that it really is that it happened that way, because all of those who were faithful have grown in grace and knowledge and closer to God. So, it served a good purpose.

And also shows us that just like King David had to learn with his episode with Bathsheba which was no minor thing—that if you are in a position of leadership, you cannot presume to sin and expect God to overlook it. When they accumulate to a huge amount, God's judgment is going to come.

So, just like with this nation, look what's happening because of leaving God. Judgments are coming.

Now perhaps with those who are exposing all the things concerning abortion—and maybe we can hit that equivalent of ten person mark in Sodom, proportionally speaking with the population, perhaps there are more people who are against abortion and want to preserve life, because they now understand it in the microscopic way that I've just discussed—that God may give us a little more time to preach the Gospel. God's timetable is *His* timetable. Many times He puts things off to show mercy, but He doesn't eliminate it all together.

Remember what happened with Josiah? Yes, they were restoring the temple, getting rid of all the pagan things that were there, and then Hilkiah the priest found the Book of the Law, buried back somewhere. I think the priests probably hid it so it wouldn't be destroyed, because that's how bad it was under Manasseh.

Hilkiah gave it to Shaphan. Shaphan brought it to Josiah and read it and Josiah ripped his clothes and wept and repented and said, 'Go to Huldah the prophetess...' Isn't that interesting? When men leave God so much, God will rely on a woman. So, don't get so uppity-uppity, all you men. God gave the message back to the king, 'Because you repented and your heart was tender, I will not do it in your day.'

What did he do? He gathered all the elders, all the priests, and he stood where the king should stand by the pillar, and he made a covenant with God and made all Israel obey God. 'You go out and tear down the idols and tear down the groves, tear down all of these things, and we'll worship God and we'll return to Him with the Passover.' Everything was fine for twelve years. Then what happened? Josiah got lifted up in vanity and said, 'I gotta go to this battle.' Even the king of Egypt said, when he heard he was coming, 'Don't come. This is not between me and you.' God even used the king of Egypt to tell him the truth. Would he listen to anybody else? *No!* He said, 'I gotta get out there and fight. I know what I'll do, I'll dress up like a regular soldier and I'll go in a chariot and I'll go out there and fight.'

What happened? An arrow found him and killed him! So, they had that space of time, but when Josiah died, then Jeremiah gave the lamentations of the book of Lamentations. If you think it's bad now, you read the book of Lamentations. That is the fulfillment of Deut. 28 and Lev. 26.

Remember, God always fulfills *His word*. So important is the Word of God and His way, that for the sake of sin by the leaders He destroyed the temple and Jerusalem twice. Think on that.

We don't know what's going to happen here. I think that with all the modern things we know concerning how new human beings are formed by God in the womb... And by the way, the argument is false that the woman has the right to her body. That is true as long as she is not pregnant. If she is pregnant there is another life in her, *which is separate from her*, and she is the mother and custodian and nurturer of the work of God going on within her.

I think at the second resurrection, it's not going to be a bunch of old fogies like us. I think it's going to be mostly children, infants, teenagers and young adults, because all of those who have been aborted had the contribution from father, the contribution from mother and the spirit of man, that the only difference between that initial conception... God said to Jeremiah, 'I knew you'; that had to be at the point of conception where all the genes and chromosomes are there to produce the physical life, as well as the spirit of man.

So then, since they had the spirit of man, and when that little baby is aborted, the spirit of man goes back to God, that has all the genes and chromosomes necessary to resurrect that infant to, I believe will be full term, the second resurrection.

Just think of what a fantastic thing that is going to be. Do you think that God is going to give Satan the devil one little, teeny, eeny-weenie victory? *No*, *He is not going to do it!* God is greater than all of us. God was involved in that conception and giving the spirit of man. The work of God was going to go on, and it will be in the second resurrection. After all, the universe is so big He probably needs every one of them. Let's see how it begins with us. You look back, and you think about the time when God began to call you. What were the circumstances? What were the situations? It's generally that you were suffering, and you had no way out of your suffering, or your life was miserable, and you didn't know how to correct it. No man, or no woman, is so good, 'God, here I am.' Isn't that true?

Paul said, 'Not of your own works, lest any man boast.' If you were perfect enough to come to God, then go back and read the book of Job. I don't you were ever as perfect as he was. God was totally just in bringing upon Job what He brought upon him, because everything that Job did to make him blameless was what God commanded.

Think on this: If you do what God says, is it your work? <u>or</u> God's work? You provide the energy, you agree to it, but *it is the work of God!*

- keeping the Sabbath is a work of God
- keeping the commandments is a work of God
- letting God's Spirit lead you is a work of God

How did God begin to call you? *I don't know*! I know how it was in my life. I was exactly as I just described. I was out walking one night in Burlingame, and the fog parted and I saw some of the stars up there and I said, 'God, help me. Only thing I know is You said ask and you shall receive.' How's that for a first prayer? I didn't know it was a prayer, but it really was.

Two weeks later I heard *The World Tomorrow* program and I said, 'That's it!' That's how I got started. I don't know how you got started. At that point I was about 25, going on 26.

The very first book I read, after I got the *Plain Truth* magazine and things like this, and they were having the series, *Satan's Great Deception* by Dr. C. Paul Meredith. I got the book, *The Two Babylons* by Alexander Hislop. That's a complicated book. It takes a long time to read it. I solved the problem of time, because I put it on my 'throne' and that's where I was reading it, which may be fitting, as I stop and think of it now. And since never having been in any church movement, or so forth, I didn't know anything about 'religion.'

God deals with us when we're in circumstances like that. This helps us get a little closer to what Paul said. He said, 'Count it all joy when you fall into different afflictions and temptations.' You can when you get through the other side and look back.

We're going to see some very important things as we go through the book of John. Let's also understand this as we're told in Isa. 28: 'line upon line; precept upon precept; here a little, there a little.'

- it's layered
- it's stacked
- it's encircled
- it is multiplied
- it is compounded

It's just like you put a speck of water on a little glass slide and you put it under a microscope and you look at that and you say, 'I'm drinking that?' because you see all these things in it.

God's Word is exactly the same. There are so many things in it, you could read it over and over and you learn more all the time, because this all comes from God.

Here's how it all begins, John 6:35: "Jesus said to them, 'I am the Bread of Life; the one who comes to Me shall never hunger; and the one who believes in Me shall never thirst at any time."" When you come to God by seeking and asking, He promises that He will give it to you.

Verse 36: "But *as* I said to you, you also have seen Me, yet, you do not believe."

Sidebar: I just found out there's a book called, *Jesus' Stenographers*, by B.J.E. Van Noort. You might look it up online. It's from a website in Holland. It's in Dutch and English. You can download it there. It's about 400 pages there. He makes the point and shows how they transcribed things in ancient times and how. Note Luke 1:1-4— eyewitnesses and ministers of the Word have written various narrations.

When did they write it? When they saw it, when they heard it! Read the Sermon on the Mount (Matt. 5, 6, 7). That has got to have been written at the time that He spoke it, because that's what the 'ministers of the Word' means. They also had shorthand. That's what I want to read.

I think that book needs to be published and gotten out as much as possible. I don't think it needs to be buried on some little website in Holland. I need to persuade the author that it needs to go out. If it can go out and if God provides the money, we'll do it. The most important event to occur in the history of man from creation to the time of Christ is the coming of the Messiah in the flesh!

You think God would leave that to lying human nature to preserve by oral tradition for 300 years? *No! That's not how God works!* He told Moses, 'Write!' He told all the prophets, 'Write!'

Likewise with His disciples, *they wrote!* What did Jesus tell John in the book of Revelation, three times? *Write!* You read the book of Revelation This is astounding! It does show exactly what Paul said that the wise of this world have had all these things shown to them, but they have rejected it, and *they became fools!* What does God do? *He turns it upside down and He calls the foolish, the weak and the lowborn!* Isn't that what God does? *Yes!* Like Paul said, 'Not many wise.' We have a few, thankfully, to keep us out of trouble. Here we are, the future rulers of the world.

If we brought in the elite of this world and said, 'Here, I want you to meet all the future rulers of this world.' *What? Where did you go to school?* 'I learned from the Bible.' *From that thing, really? How are you going to rule the world?* 'Just wait, God has some surprises for you. When He shows Himself in His return, you're going to be a different person.'

Verse 36: "But *as* I said to you, you also have seen Me, yet, you do not believe. **All whom the Father gives Me** <u>shall come to Me</u>... [I want you to understand how important being called of God is and answering that call really becomes] ...and the one who comes to Me I will in no wise cast out. For I did not come down from heaven to do My own will, but the will of Him Who sent Me. And this is the will of the Father, Who sent Me: that *of* all whom He has given Me, I should not lose any, but should raise them up in the last day" (vs 36-39). That's Pentecost, because that the last day of the count. That's not the Last Great Day.

The only way, the only thing that can take you out of God's hands is *you yourself by rejecting God after you have received the Holy Spirit of God!* You can go to our series in *Hebrews*, we have two on the unpardonable sin. But that is an absolute rejection and just casting God aside, after you have received the knowledge of the Truth, and you have the Holy Spirit of God, and you have lived in God's way. Then you reject it. No one else can do it.

Verse 41: "Then the Jews were complaining against Him, because He said, 'I AM the Bread that came down from heaven." I imagine they were. 'How can He say that? Look, He's a human being.'

Verse 42: "And they were saying, 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? Why then does He say, "I came down from heaven"?" They were complaining toward each other.

That's why what God is doing with us is not a religion. It is a way of life that God has given to us. It doesn't matter who you are; it doesn't matter how lowly you may be counted in the world, or how exalted that you are in the world.

Remember, you read Dan. 4, speaking of someone who is exalted, that is an epistle from King Nebuchadnezzar to all the kings and people in the world. You go read it. He wrote it. Did God humble him? *Yes, He did!* Was he converted? *I doubt it, but he was humbled!*

Verse 44: "No one can come to Me unless the Father, Who sent me, draws him…" We're going to see your calling, your Christian life, your growing and overcoming is by the joint effort of God the Father and Jesus Christ together. That's what's important.

The reason that it is, is so that when we come across times that are difficult and trying, and we are facing death, and seeing death, God the Father is involved directly in every one of our lives. Think of that! The *great Sovereign* of the universe!

That's why, if you don't have the series, *Grace Upon Grace*, you get that. What a fantastic grace and grace upon grace that you have contact with God the Father and He has contact with you.

Don't go around and say, 'Woe is me. Poor little me. I'm going through all this' and have a big pity-party. Look at what God has done. Are you important to God? Is He going to give you eternal life? That is so important, it's indescribable.

"...Who sent Me, draws him; and I will raise him up at the last day.... [notice how you're going to be qualified, in the end result] ...It is written in the prophets, 'and **they shall all be taught by God.**'...." (vs 44-45). Think of that!

That is so important, that's why we have to, as Paul said to Timothy, 'rightly divide the Word of God.' Don't bring in any man-made theories. If you bring that in to the Word of God, that is equivalent to genetic-engineering, and you get the wrong thing. The ultimate of genetic-engineering is that *it doesn't reproduce its own seed!* We have the seed of God. That's why it has to be the Word of God.

"...Therefore, everyone who has heard from the Father, and has learned, comes to Me. No one has seen the Father except He Who is from God; He has seen the Father. Truly, truly I say to you, the one who believes in Me has eternal life" (vs 45-47).

Verse 63: "It is the Spirit that gives life... [The spirit of man gives life to the physical body. The Holy Spirit of God gives us the seed and begettal of eternal life.] ...the flesh profits nothing...."

Stop and think on this: How many great, intelligent people think that they can improve on what God has done?

- Is God perfect? Yes, He is!
- Are His laws perfect? Yes, they are!
- Is His love perfect? Yes, it is!

Only God can perfect you. You can't add to God, but He can add to you.

Randy and I did a little research on Thursday concerning a little Swiss town called Cern. There, 350 feet below the town of Cern, they have the greatest instrument that man has ever created. It is so awesome and so deadly that even the atheist Hawkins said, 'Don't do it.'

Do yourself a Google-search and find out, but I'm going to give a sermon on it. That sermon is based upon the words of Christ (Matt. 24). He said that 'unless these days at the end were <u>limited</u>, there would be no flesh saved alive.' Because that great instrument that they have there—and I'll bring all the details on it when I bring the sermon, and we're going to give lots of video clips on it—the top scientists against it are warning that they are dealing with things that could destroy the whole earth.

I want you to understand why God has called us. Don't be afraid of it. God is going to take care of it. But we need to let things like this give us more drive and more zeal and more love to serve God. His plan is so great and He is going to end all of this.

- that's why we're here
- that's why we live
- that's why we learn
- that's why we die

God is going to make it right *His* way.

Verse 63: "It is the Spirit that gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you, *they* are spirit and *they* are life." That's why, with the Spirit of God, we need to study and pray, because God wants us to grow in grace and knowledge and develop the character that He wants to give us. But we have to be wholly involved in the process.

Jesus' disciples didn't understand this when He spoke it. They didn't know what was going to happen. They didn't have a clue concerning the coming crucifixion. John 14-17 are some of the greatest parts of the Bible for us to know and to understand.

John 14:6: "Jesus said to him, 'I am the Way, and the Truth, and the Life; no one comes to the Father except through Me.""

Understand this: God the Father and Jesus Christ work jointly together with us. John wrote in 1-John 2 that if you don't have the Father and the Son, both, you do not have eternal life.

- the Jews reject Jesus and claim that the Lord of the Old Testament is the Father
- the Protestants set aside the Father and say Jesus only

Neither one of them have eternal life!

Until different ministers in the Churches of God understand that Protestantism is the greatest counterfeit that Satan can devise with another Jesus, and get back to the Bible the way they should, *they are in deep trouble!* No one can come to the Father except through Christ!

The next few verses that I'm going to read are the most important in the Bible, having to do with the key and the secret of conversion, spiritual growth, understanding our calling and preparing for eternal life.

Verse 15: "If you love Me, keep the commandments—namely, My commandments. And I will ask the Father, and He shall give you another Comforter, that it may be with you throughout the age: *Even* the Spirit of the Truth, which the world cannot receive because it perceives it not, nor knows it; but you know it because it dwells with you, **and shall be within you**" (vs 15-17). That's the important thing, *the Spirit of God within us!*

Let's examine this a little bit further as He goes on, v 18: "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you." How's He going to come to them? He came back to them after His resurrection for forty days and forty nights. That's part of it, but how does Jesus come to us? By opening our minds, and then the Father begins to lead us!

Verse 19: "Yet, a little while and the world shall see Me no longer; but you shall see Me. Because I live, you shall live also. In that day, you shall know that I am in My Father, and you *are* in Me, and I am in you. <u>The one who has My</u> <u>commandments and is keeping them, that is the</u> <u>one who loves Me; and the one who loves Me</u> <u>shall be loved by My Father</u>..." (vs 19-21).

When you have trouble and affliction go to God. Don't go to your pity-party over in a corner and bawl your stupid eyes out and feel sorry for yourself. If you have real grief, go ahead and cry, *but come to God and let God lift you up out of it, because God loves you!* The Father Himself loves you. How do we pray? *Our Father in heaven*; direct access!

"...shall be loved by My Father, and I will love him and will manifest Myself to him.' Judas (not Iscariot) said to him, 'Lord, what has happened that You are about to manifest Yourself to us, and not to the world?" (vs 21-22). Judas is saying, 'Lord, how's that going to happen? How are you going to do that? The world can't see You?' Verse 23 becomes the most important verse in conversion, because conversion is *the joint effort* of God the Father and Jesus Christ:

Verse 23: "Jesus answered and said to him, 'If anyone loves Me, he will keep My Word... [His whole message] ...and <u>My Father will love him</u>..." Hw says it twice. John 16:27 says that you pray to the Father *directly* because *the Father Himself* loves you. That is something!

"...and <u>We</u> will come to him and make Our abode with him" (v 23). When you receive the Holy Spirit of God, it is the begettal from the Father to become *His children*, and from Christ to develop the mind of Christ so that you can develop the character of God. Both together.

"...and We...will make Our abode... [dwelling place] ...with him. The one who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word that you hear is not Mine, but the Father's, Who sent Me" (vs 23-24). That's quite a thing!

Verse 26: "But *when* the Comforter *comes*, *even* the Holy Spirit, which the Father will send in My name, that one shall teach you all things, and shall bring to your remembrance everything that I have told you."

For what purpose? Obviously, they weren't writing this down, because they were just finishing the Passover and getting ready to go. "...which the Father will send in My name..."

John 15:26: "But when the Comforter has come, which I will send to you from the Father, *even* the Spirit of the Truth, **which proceeds from the Father, that one shall bear witness of Me**."

That's something—isn't it? Most important thing to understand concerning conversion, which helps us in growing and overcoming is, it is a joint process of the Holy Spirit, the power of God, from the Father and from the Son, combined.

John 16:13: "However, when that one has come, *even* the Spirit of the Truth, it will lead you into all Truth because it shall not speak from itself, but whatever it shall hear, it shall speak. And it shall disclose to you the things to come."

Verse 12: "I have yet many things to tell you, but you are not able to bear them now." What was the most important thing that He had to reveal?

Ephesians was written from Rome while Paul was in prison, between 61 and $63_{A,D}$. Here is the most important thing that was revealed to the apostles and the prophets. They couldn't take it right then. They weren't able to receive it.

Ephesians 3:1: "For this cause I, Paul, *am* the prisoner of Christ Jesus for you Gentiles, if indeed you have heard of the ministry of <u>the grace</u> of God that was given to me for you; how He made known to me by revelation the mystery... [secret of God] ...(even as I wrote briefly before, so that when you read *this*, you will be able to comprehend my understanding in the mystery of Christ), which in other generations was not made known to the sons of men, as it has now been revealed... [at the time he was writing, it was revealed shortly before] ...now been revealed to His Holy apostles..." (vs 1-5).

This is why Peter writes that you've been begotten again. This is why John writes what he writes. God revealed this to all of them.

"...and prophets by *the* Spirit; that the Gentiles might be joint heirs, and a joint body, and joint partakers of His promise in Christ through the Gospel" (vs 5-6). He says that this came because of the power of God.

Verse 9: "And that I might enlighten all *as* to what is the fellowship..." This sums it up and there are many other verses I'll try and bring this next week to add to it.

Verse 14: "For this cause I bow my knees to the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, of Whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named" (vs 14-15). That is us! We're all going to receive a new name.

What happens when a baby is born? You say, 'What are you going to call him?' So, you name him. When we're resurrected, we're going to receive a new name. Isn't that going to be something?

Verse 16: "That He may grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power by His Spirit in the inner man." That's what God wants, so that regardless of what comes along, you're going to be loving God and serving Him.

Verse 17: "That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; and that being rooted and grounded in love..." (vs 17-18).

I'm glad you're all going through the *Love Series*. That's the most important thing. That's why, over here to the west of us, that whole church failed.

- they didn't preach the love of God
- they didn't preach the grace of God
- they didn't preach the direct connection between you and God the Father and Jesus Christ

—which you have direct access through the grace of God, *separate from* any human authority.

How important was that? So much so that when the corruption broke out, God had to get rid of *it*! Did He get rid of Jerusalem? Yes, twice. We need to learn from happened down the street.

Verse 18: "And that being rooted and grounded in love, you may be fully able to comprehend with all the saints..." He doesn't want us to be dumb, stupid followers. He wants us to be smart, intelligent, understanding, but humble because we have the Spirit of God.

"...what *is* the breadth and length and depth and height, and to know the love of Christ... [And the Father] ...which surpasses *human* knowledge..." (vs 18-19). There's nothing greater. You can be the most educated person in the world, but if you don't know about God the Father and Jesus Christ, you know nothing! When you die, it's all gone.

Notice, the whole purpose in all of this, "...<u>so that you may be filled with all the fullness</u> <u>of God</u>" (v 19). May we comprehend that, brethren. May we understand that even just a wee little bit.

Notice the promise, v 20: "Now to Him Who is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think..." God's plan is so great that there is no way we can contemplate but just a little bit of it. Like Paul says, 'Looking through the glass darkly.'

"...according to the power that is working in us, to Him [the Father] *be* glory in the Church by Christ Jesus throughout all generations, *even* into the ages of eternity. Amen" (vs 20-21).

That's how we begin and that is how God wants us to end!
